GARIMA GOSPELS – book

J. McKenzie and F. Watson, with photographs by M. Gervers, *The Garima Gospels: Early Illuminated Gospel Books from Ethiopia* (Oxford 2016).

Includes full page colour reproductions of all of the illuminated pages of all three Garima volumes. All of the photos in the Oxford exhibition, including the comparanda, are reproduced in it.

AG I and III appeared on the HMML website in October 2016. (You need an account for access. They are not easy to find on the site, so bookmark the direct links above. Once you have logged in, go back to the bookmark for each volume.) The pages there are presented and numbered in the sequence of the 2013 repairs. They can also make Davies' microfilms available online temporarily, when asked.

The HMML photos were taken in strong artificial light, eliminating many surface details needed for studying the illuminations. However, these are visible in Michael Gervers' photographs in McKenzie and Watson 2016.

AG II: The only potentially available copy of the text of AG II at present is the Davies' microfilm at HMML. The only published colour copies of the illuminated pages of AG II are in McKenzie and Watson 2016.
