This series of lectures explores Lucian's *True Histories* from many different angles. The first lecture gives an overview of this brilliant, bonkers text as a whole, and outlines the main traps to *avoid* when thinking and writing about it. The following two lectures focus on *VH* 1 and 2 respectively, tacking themes such as truth and deception, genre and history, landscape and travel, bodies and ghosts. The final lecture looks at the two books comparatively, through some close analysis of key passages. The survey lecture on Wednesday of Week 8 (on Imperial Greek Literature) is an important complement to this series.

The lectures are intended for all those studying (new) Mods Greek Literature, but all are welcome.

The sequence is as follows:

1 (MT 5): 'Overview': Themes, Traps and Tropes

2 (MT 6): VH 1: Lying, Truth and Travel

3 (MT 7): VH 2: Literary Ghosts

4 (MT 8): Into the Belly of the VH: Close Reading Key Passages
