Where to find the Ioannou Centre

The Ioannou Centre for Classical and Byzantine Studies is on the west side of St Giles', the main thoroughfare running northwards out of Oxford city centre, opposite St John's College. From the corner of St Giles' and Beaumont Street by the Ashmolean Museum, walk along St Giles' in a northerly direction for approximately 50 metres. The entrance to the Classics Centre is on your left, just before the red telephone box, in a four-storey Victorian building.



You should be able to open the outer set of doors by swiping your University Card vertically through the swipecard reader on the right of the entrance lobby. If your card does not work, please press the green bell button to speak to the receptionist via the intercom.

The second set of double doors is opened by pressing the button on the front of the rail immediately to the right of the doors.

The lecture theatre is on the left hand side of the atrium. If you arrive early, please meet in the common room on the right hand side of the atrium, opposite the lecture theatre.

Where to find the Sackler Library

The Sackler Library is at the southern end of St John Street, off Beaumont Street. It is about 3-4 minutes' walk from the Ioannou Centre.

Beaumont Street is a major thoroughfare running east-west from the Ashmolean Museum and the Randolph Hotel towards Worcester College. St John Street is approximately half way along Beaumont Street on the northern side. As you enter St John Street, the library entrance is almost immediately on your right. Entrance to the Sackler Library is via a doorway in a rotunda. See
